Our Vision: A Greenville County where every student achieves their full potential.

Our Mission: To bridge the gap between communities and schools, invest in data-driven strategies, and evaluate program effectiveness to eliminate barriers and advance student success.



OnTrack Greenville's three strategic goals empower students for success:

- 1. **Prioritize Student Well-Being:** Data-driven mental and emotional support interventions improve student well-being, fostering a foundation for academic success. (Currently, over 33% of students report poor/fair mental health.)
- 2. Increase Graduation Rates: Targeted interventions and strong school partnerships aim to boost graduation rates to 80%, particularly for disadvantaged students in the White Horse Road Community.
- 3. Prepare for College & Careers: Equipping students with essential skills and connections, OnTrack strives for 73% of seniors to be college and career ready (CCR), driving long-term economic mobility.





OnTrack Greenville: 2023-2024 Changes

This year, OnTrack Greenville made significant strides in empowering students and strengthening our community:

- Expanded Strategic Goals: Beyond graduation rates, OnTrack now prioritizes student well-being and college/career readiness, providing holistic support for student success.
- Strengthened Tiered Support System: OnTrack provides multi-tiered support: Tier III (individualized case management), Tier II (targeted group programs), and Tier I (school-wide initiatives) to address diverse student needs.
- Advanced Community School Model: Deepened partnerships between schools, families, and community
 organizations create a unified support system for student learning.
- Prioritized Data-Driven Evaluation: Utilizing quantitative and qualitative data (surveys, case studies), OnTrack
 measures impact and ensures continuous improvement.



OnTrack Greenville: 2023-2024 Key Accomplishments & Wins

OnTrack Greenville celebrated significant achievements this year, demonstrating impactful progress:

- Nationally Recognized: OnTrack co-facilitated a national conference discussion on the community schools model and received recognition from the Department of Education and The Grad Partnership for strong implementation.
- Mentorship Expansion: Partnering with Mentor Upstate and USC, OnTrack trained 315+ mentors, gaining national recognition for its mentorship program.
- Enhanced Parent Engagement: OnTrack and GCS launched a

- groundbreaking multi-school PTA in the White Horse Road community, boosting parent involvement.
- Secured GEAR UP Grant: OnTrack played a key role in Greenville County Schools securing the GEAR UP grant, supporting low-income students' postsecondary preparation through a cohort model starting in middle school.
- Addressing Financial Literacy Gaps: Partnering with the Greenville County Human Relations Commission, OnTrack's CFE initiative is developing a tailored financial education curriculum, emphasizing family involvement to improve college/career financial planning.



OnTrack Greenville: 2023-2024 Impact by the Numbers

OnTrack Greenville demonstrated significant impact across key areas this school year:

- Tier III Support: 521 students received case management services with over 4,100 supports provided.
- Tier II Support: 182 students participated in the BellXcel summer program, achieving an impressive 86% average daily attendance.
- Mentorship: 315+ mentors were trained, with 61 prospective mentors matched with organizations.
- Menu of Supports: OnTrack sponsored 85 events, resulting in 15,841 touchpoints across students, staff, and families.
- School-Based Health: 200+ students received vital health services, including exams, pediatric visits, and vaccinations.
- Family Supports: 607 families received utility, rental, food, housing, and other critical resources.
- PACT: 40+ organizations engaged in PACT initiatives, which included empowering student leaders through student government association meetings.
- Senior Send-Off: 350+ graduating seniors were celebrated and provided with valuable resources.
